Towns across Wisconsin already have. Here is how Ashland and Bayfield County do the same.

1 Get on the list

Add your name so we move as a group, not a crowd that scatters. A connected handful beats a hundred strangers.

2 Get the facts

Public-records requests to the Bayfield County Sheriff, Ashland PD, and WisDOT: how many cameras, the cost, the contract dates, and who gets the data.

3 Find the allies

Link up with neighbors, the ACLU of Wisconsin, and EFF, who work on exactly this.

4 Build the pressure

A petition, an op-ed in the local paper, and a packed room when the contract comes up for renewal this fall.

5 Outlast the cameras

Keep at it until they come down, and write the rules so they cannot quietly come back.

It is winnable.

Verona, Oshkosh, and Dane County have already pulled the plug on Flock. The Northwoods is next.
